

DOMINANT ROLE IN THE IOWA ECONOMY

- Advanced manufacturing is the largest industry sector in Iowa, contributing nearly \$35 billion to the state's economy (Bureau of Economic Analysis, 2024)
- Advanced manufacturing represents 17% of Iowa's GDP (Bureau of Economic Analysis, 2024)
- Approximately 4,200 manufacturers employ over 222,000 Iowans (Bureau of Labor Statistics, 2024)
- Iowa has 11 times the concentration of agricultural and construction equipment manufacturing employees compared to the rest of the U.S. (Bureau of Labor Statistics, 2024)
- Iowa's agricultural and construction equipment manufacturers have over 24,000 employees with sales over \$20 billion (U.S. Census Bureau, 2023 and Bureau of Labor Statistics, 2024)

- Iowa's recent corporate and personal income tax reforms are significantly enhancing its business competitiveness.
- Iowa's tradition of inter-firm collaboration, lean manufacturing contributes to supply chain efficiencies
- 201 machine shops support Iowa manufacturers by providing specialized fabrication services (Bureau of Labor Statistics, 2024)


COMPANIES AT WORK IN IOWA
