## **Program Overview**



➢Only those communities that completed the Comprehensive Neighborhood Revitalization Planning Grant, submitted their plan timely for review and were chosen to move forward, are eligible to apply for these funds.

➤There is \$3M available of the 2024 funding allocation for this program.

≻The maximum award per project is \$1.75M.

>There is also a local match requirement of 15%.

≻Three communities will be applying for the Comprehensive Neighborhood Revitalization Grant this round. Only 2 will be awarded.

# **Program Overview**

### > Application Round

Application window was too open today, April 1, 2025, but there has been a delay. No later than the end of the business day, Monday, April 7, 2025.
 Deadline for submittal will be May 30, 2025, at 11:59 PM.
 Contract period will be 4 years with no extensions.

#### Project Limit

□ If you currently have an open DTR grant, you may not include it as one of your activities in the CNRG application.

### Chosen Activities

The community must choose from the activities identified in their plan, as to those they will implement. Minimum number required is three (3) per grant, but not to exceed 5 total. The application will require specific information as to WHO and HOW these activities will affect the community when implemented.

## Meeting a National Objective

<u>Reminder</u>: The project's Target Area must have no more than 200 households and is required to meet the 51% Low-to-Moderate Income threshold. (Should have been documented in the CNRPG application.)

Depending on the activities designated for implementation, you may also be required to meet HUD's CDBG National Objective of Slum and Blight.

> Demographic Data will be required for each project activity.

## **Environmental Review Forms**

>Environmental Requirements:

This program requires a tiered review; however, this could be subject to change.

If awarded, the Environmental Officer will work with you on how to proceed.



# **Scoring Method**

 $\succ$  There are five (5) criteria scored on a 1 to 5 scale.

#### Project Activities:

• How well do the activities that are listed for implementation match those that were listed in the plan priorities.

- Project Impact:
  - How impactful will the proposed project be on the economic and community development of the Target Area.
- Eligibility and National Objectives:
  - Based on the information provided in the application, will all proposed activities be eligible and meet Nation Objective.
- Degree of Leveraging:
- Capacity to complete and maintain the project.
- Plus, two (2) criteria, Federal Opportunity Zone and Iowa Great Places, that are either "Yes" for 3 points or "No" for 0 points. Maximum of 31 points for a "perfect" application.
- > Applications scoring less than about 20 points will probably not be funded.

> Applications are usually evaluated by two or three persons; scores are averaged.
